



St Mary's CofE Primary School Sports Premium Impact, 2019-2020

Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<p>Sports week was replaced by virtual sports week this year due to COVID19.</p> <p>Tri-golf equipment was purchased, however due to COVID19, the club was not introduced.</p> <p>Active10 club was introduced as a short burst of fitness before the school day. This only ran for a 2 week period before lockdown. This will be continued next year, with sports crew being used to run this.</p> <p>Playground markings have been renewed in both the KS1 and KS2 areas, including a number of fitness activities for use in lessons and at break times, encouraging regular physical activity.</p> <p>Extra curricular uptake had been high during Autumn and Spring terms, with 60% and 52% of KS2 taking part in regular extra-curricular clubs during these times.</p> <p>Sportsmark has been retained at GOLD level for another year. COVID19 stopped the assessment of a new award, but we were on track to retain gold for another year. KS1 award has also been retained at SILVER.</p> <p>Equipment for KS1 to develop gross motor skills and large scale movements in the outdoor classroom has been purchased and is in place, with children having daily access to.</p> <p>New sports kit purchased, with tournament shirts now in use. There are sets for LKS2 and UKS2 which can be worn when it is not appropriate to wear football kits. Staff shirts have also been purchased for all members of teaching staff.</p> <p>Sports markings painted on four playgrounds to allow for use during lessons, breaktime, lunchtime and extra-curricular clubs</p>	<p>Repeat the 2019 sports week, inviting a wider range of 'new' and unfamiliar sports. Encourage these groups to run clubs after-school.</p> <p>Embed sports leaders' Physi-Fun club and train them to also lead tri-golf club, adding a new sport available at lunchtime. This action was delayed from the previous year due to COVID19 restrictions.</p> <p>Maintain Active10 club when COVID restrictions allow for it to take place again. Train sports crew in the running of this club.</p> <p>Renew gold sports mark when assessment is re-introduced next year aiming for platinum award the following year. KS1 to be re-applied for.</p> <p>Arrange for the school to be remapped following building works, for use in orienteering activities by all year groups.</p>
