Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to school and what we hope will be an exciting year ahead for your children in year 4. We hope this letter will answer some of the questions parents have at the start of the year.

Trips

As I'm sure you're aware, we are going to Ufton Court for an overnight trip in October. There will be a meeting for parents about this in the Junior hall on Thursday 7th September at 3.45pm.

We will also visit Bough Beech Reservoir and Pizza Express but these trips happen later in the year and are yet to be confirmed.

Key Dates

The school website has full information about the term dates, whole school events and INSET days but please take note of these dates that are especially important to Year 4.

Wednesday 4th October – Thursday 5th October = Ufton Court (4SW & 4OR)

Thursday 5th October – Friday 6th October = Ufton Court (4CW & 4SB)

School Resources

Children need a well-stocked pencil cases. Please can you provide blue hand writing pens, pencils, rubbers, a short ruler (or long if it fits in the pencil case) and a glue stick. Children may also want to have their own colour pencils or felt tips. They do not need gel pens. Pencil cases will be kept at school and sent home at the end of each half term for a tidy and refresh.

Curriculum

This term children will be learning about the Anglo Saxons in History, Sound in Science, making Anglo Saxon helmets in Art, covering the Bible's Big story in RE, Online safety and Word Processing in Computing and learning how to manage our emotions in Life Skills and Wellbeing. Maths covers a broad range of topics starting with place value, calculation including fractions and decimals/percentages. Literacy will be text-based learning with regular reading comprehension, spelling and grammar activities to develop these aspects of the curriculum. 
Homework

Children will no longer be required to practise spellings at home. We will now be focusing on the learning of spellings at school. The focus for learning at home should be reading regularly and times table revision.

Children are expected to read every day for 20 minutes or more (aim for at least 5 days a week). Reading can be a mix of reading aloud and reading independently. Please support this by making sure your child



















has some time each day to do this without interruption from conversation, television or the temptation of gadgets. Reading should be recorded in their reading journals, which we will explain to the children when we return to school. These will be checked on a Monday morning. Reading and developing your child's vocabulary are the best ways to support your child's learning this year!

• Tables tests: Children will be tested on tables each Friday. The test will build up to cover all tables up to 12x12 and the related division facts. It is very important that children are fluent with their tables and although we will be doing some practise in school, they will need to continue to recite the times tables at home so that they increase their speed of recall. The ability to quickly recall multiplication and division facts supports all other areas of maths but it is also very important in Year 4, as we have an official Times Table Check that needs to be completed online in June 2024.

Uniform

Children should arrive to school each day in the correct uniform. PE kit should be worn to school on a **Monday** (4OR & 4SB), Thursday (all classes) & Friday (4SW & 4CW). Please make sure children are suitably dressed so they do not feel too cold. Children must not wear any jewellery with the exception of small stud earrings. Under Surrey Schools Health and Safety Policy, children may not wear earrings for PE/Games or any school sports activities including tournaments and dance performances. We therefore ask that if your child has not yet had their ears pierced you refrain from allowing them to do so until the start of the summer holidays next year when there is enough time for the piercing to heal. Any child who is wearing earrings on PE days must be able to remove and replace them by themselves. Alternatively, please remove the earrings before school.
